SPECIAL LEADER INFORMATION

We are extremely excited to have you as a youth leader involved with your youth at Snow Camp. The amount of involvement that you have with your youth during the weekend is totally up to you. Some youth leaders desire to use this as a leaders' retreat, therefore allowing them the freedom to drop their teens off at Word of Life Bible Institute and spend time together. Other leaders may choose to be more directly involved with the youth during the Snow Camp weekend. You are more than welcome to attend any of the activities and meetings at the Bible Institute throughout the weekend. We have designed a program that allows you the freedom to choose the amount of your involvement during the weekend.

Purpose

The purpose of Word of Life Snow Camp is the evangelization and discipleship of youth through various means consistent with the Holy Scriptures to help build and strengthen the church of Jesus Christ.

Structure

The meetings throughout the Snow Camp weekend are structured with a purpose: Friday evening we present the gospel with a public invitation, Saturday evening will vary depending on the speaker (topics such as but not limited to: temptation, anger, bitterness, relationships, etc.), and Sunday morning's service is geared towards dedication.

LEADERS' MEETINGS DURING SNOW CAMP

We will have two leaders' meetings at the Bible Institute to help you maximize the weekend's impact on your teens.

Friday in the Bible Institute Dining Room Annex

Friday's meeting in the Bible Institute Dining Room Annex will be an introduction to Snow Camp where we will introduce staff, announce any changes for 2009, and allow you to ask questions. We will also collect names of unsaved campers you would like us to pray for throughout the weekend. This is a very important meeting that you will not want to miss. We will communicate location and time at Registration (typically 8:00 pm in the annex).

Sunday Breakfast at the Bible Institute

The Leaders' Breakfast on Sunday morning will give you an opportunity to share testimonies of God's working in the lives of your youth over the weekend. It is free, but you must have a ticket (available at check-in). The meeting will be held in our newly renovated Student Lounge under Asia dorm.

IMPORTANT:

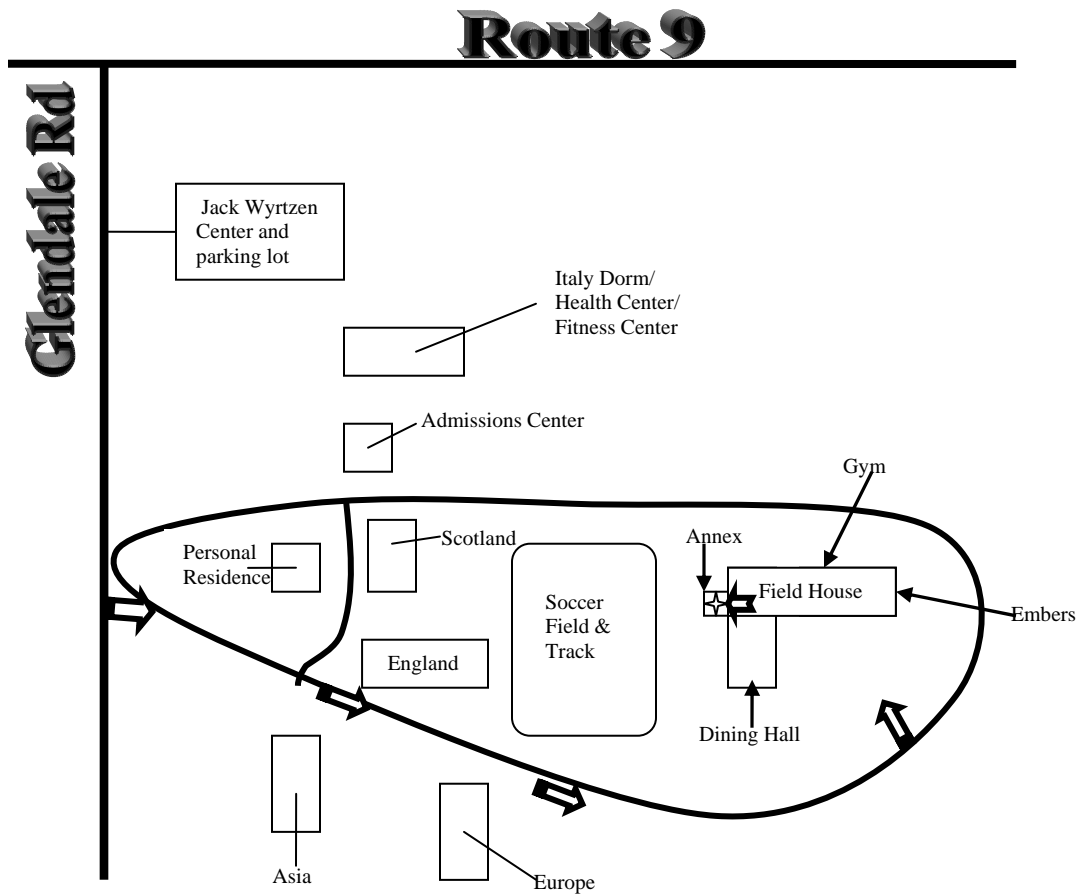
- The Command Center – As always, the Command Center, located in the Dining Room Annex, is staffed all weekend, 24 hours. Our desire is to serve you and provide a way for you to contact any of our Snow Camp Leadership in a matter of minutes. Please do not hesitate to stop by for any reason.
- Coffee – Coffee and other hot drinks are available for you all weekend at no charge. We will have a table set up in the dining room annex just for you.
- Meal Package – A discounted meal package may be purchased for \$25 (a savings of \$11). The weekend meal ticket for Children ages 4-11 is \$15. It must be ordered in advance by calling 1-800-965-7177, Monday – Friday 9AM - 5PM. It includes: Friday – Supper, Saturday - Breakfast, Lunch and Supper, Sunday - Breakfast and Lunch.

REGISTRATION AND LATE ARRIVAL INSTRUCTIONS:

The Command Center is the final destination for all late arrivals and is located in the Dining Room Annex (indicated with a star).

Traveling North on I-87: Take the Pottersville Exit, #26. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp. Continue on this road for 4/10 of a mile until you reach a stop sign. At the stop sign turn right (north) onto Route 9. Continue north on Route 9 for 7/10 of a mile and turn right onto Glendale Road. Take your second left into the Bible Institute entrance (about 3/10 of a mile) and bear right. Follow this road until you reach the Field House. Registration will be held at the Embers Snack Shack until 5:00pm. After 5:00pm, please go to the Command Center to check in. Embers and the Command Center are at opposite ends of the Field House (follow the arrows on the map to reach your final destination).

Traveling South on I-87: Take the Pottersville Exit, #26. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp. Turn right (south) onto Route 9 at the stop sign. Go South on Route 9 for approximately 1/10 of a mile and take your first left onto Glendale Rd. Take your second left into the Bible Institute entrance (about 3/10 of a mile) and bear right. Follow this road until you reach the Field House. Registration will be held at the Embers Snack Shack until 5:00pm. After 5:00pm, please go to the Command Center to check in. Embers and the Command Center are at opposite ends of the Field House (follow the arrows on the map to reach your final destination).

Checklist for Easy Snow Camp Check-in

In our ongoing effort to expedite your check-in process, we ask that you follow the instructions listed below before you arrive for Snow Camp.

- Distribute a Health Form to each camper. Health Forms and instructions may be downloaded from our website, www.wol.org, or go to the link provided in your e-confirmation. Instruct the campers to return the forms to you by a certain date. Make sure when they are returned to you that the forms are filled in COMPLETELY and signed by a parent. Organize the Health Forms alphabetically. Mail completed Health Forms to arrive at Word of Life 2 weeks prior to arrival. (Please keep a copy of each health form and bring it with you to registration, in case of lost mail). Please send to Word of Life Camp Registrar, PO Box 600, Schroon Lake, NY 12870.
- Complete all camper information requested in your online account. We need to have the individual information requested for each camper no later than 2 weeks prior to your arrival. This includes name, address, phone number, date of birth and parent's name. You can make changes to your camper roster online, but cancelling spaces or campers must be handled through a registrar by calling 1-800-965-7177. (Please keep our cancellation and refund policies in mind when making changes.)
- If you did not note it when your reservation was made, notify a registrar by calling 1-800-965-7177 if your group will be participating in the optional ski package at Gore Mountain. Complete and return the "Pre-Camp Ski Package" Information Form located at www.wol.org, or go to the link provided in your e-confirmation.
- Pre-pay your entire balance two or more weeks prior to your arrival. All reservations must be paid in full 2 weeks prior to arrival to avoid cancellation. Please go to your online account or call us toll-free at 1-800-965-7177 to pay your balance due.
- Arrive at Snow Camp. Registration begins at 3:00pm at the Bible Institute Embers, located at the far end of the Field House. Please do not bring your campers into the registration line, unless they have medication to turn in to the camp nurse. Campers without medications should remain in the gym until you complete the registration process.
- Sign up for Sports Competitions and Activities.
- Meet counselors and transport your campers and luggage to their cabins.

Cancellations/Refunds

Advance registration deposits are non-refundable. Balances are non-refundable within 2 weeks of arrival. If you desire to replace one camper with another, this is acceptable without penalties. All reservations must be paid in full 2 weeks prior to arrival to avoid cancellation.

Cabin Assignments

Housing assignments will be based upon the number in your group and availability. Assignments are made before you arrive. We generally try to keep groups together. Please be flexible in this area as we try our best to accommodate everyone's needs. If you have special housing requests, please notify us early.

Although this may require a little more "pre-arrival" work on your part, we hope this shortens your "post-arrival" registration time. We really do appreciate all that you do to get your teens to Snow Camp. If there is anything we as a staff can do to help you in this process, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Banner Competition: Based on “Cold Rush” theme, spiritual emphasis, church name, creativity and construction.

Cardboard Sled Race: (Build these ahead of time or bring the supplies and work on it as a group project at camp.)

Design Competition: Sleds are judged on originality, complexity, color, and “Cold Rush” theme

Race Competition: Sleds are timed
Maximum of 5 people per sled

Construction Guidelines: (for both design and race competition)

- Sled may be constructed of cardboard, PVC, tape, glue, string, inner tubes, rope, etc.
- The sled needs to fit through a 5’X8’ doorway
- No part of the sled's construction may be made of wood or metal (including fasteners, nails or screws)
- No part of the sled may be made of items originally manufactured for sledding purposes (it is acceptable to use tires or inner tubes).
- The only permissible material on the bottom of the sled (what will touch the snow) is cardboard (a wax coating and tape is permissible). This is a safety concern, as other material can accelerate the sled to an unsafe speed.

**Construction Guidelines must be followed completely in order to be entered in either competition.*

Activity Descriptions

Trail Rides - \$10 per 1/2 hour

Trail Rides are available Saturday morning and afternoon. Sign-ups for trail rides begin on Friday afternoon. These are guided horseback trail rides for one half-hour time slots. It is extremely important that those participating in the trail rides arrive at the stables ten minutes before their scheduled ride. This will allow smooth operation of the schedule throughout the day. We have approximately 80 slots available for Snow Campers to participate in this activity.

Snowmobiling - \$15 per 1/2 hour

Snowmobiling occurs in half-hour sessions. Drivers are not required to have a driver's license, learner's permit, or be of a certain age. They simply must be able to handle the machine. Drivers operate the snowmobiles at their own pace in a controlled, groomed area. Snowmobiling takes place Friday evening, Saturday morning, Saturday afternoon, and Saturday evening. The snowmobiles are designed for one-person operation, therefore no doubling is permitted and time slots may not be shared (one person per sled, per time slot.)

Snow Shoe Expeditions

Snow Shoe Expeditions run for approximately an hour to an hour and a half per session. A guide/instructor is provided to enable you to have a more enjoyable experience. You will learn how to properly use the snowshoes and be able to find your way easily throughout the wooded area of campus.

Obstacle Course

The Obstacle Course is a free activity. This is an activity where first, second, and third place win points towards the overall group competition for the weekend. There are no sign-ups for this - it is open Friday evening, Saturday morning, and Saturday afternoon. All you need to do is show up and enjoy the activity.

Paintball - \$10 per 1 1/2 hour

Paintball is available all day Saturday and is located in the woods to the left of the tube hill. Sign-ups will be on Friday afternoon. Markers, 100 paint balls, as well as all other safety equipment will be provided. Additional ammunition may be purchased (\$5 for 50, \$10 for 150.) Players must use WOL equipment only, with the exception of the mask, which is subject to WOL approval. Do not bring personal paintballs, paintball guns or markers.

Speed Paintball Tournament

\$15 per team, entry fee gives use of marker/mask and 100 paintballs per player. Extra paint can be purchased at the tournament. Teams will play at least 3 games with an accumulative scoring point system. Teams consist of 5 players. Players must use WOL equipment only, with the exception of the mask, which is subject to WOL approval. Do not bring personal paintballs or paintball markers.

Cardboard Sled Race

The Cardboard Sled Race is an exciting group activity that takes place Saturday evening. There are two parts to the Cardboard Sled competition. For sleds entered in the design competition, sleds will be judged during the Card Board Sled Parade before the race. Sleds are timed with the fastest sled being the winner. (See Construction Rules and Guidelines on page 10.) The winner of the Cardboard Sled Race receives a certificate for one free weekend of Snow Camp for one individual for the 2010 Snow Camp season. It's always an exciting time to watch the sleds come down the tube hill and wonder if they will actually make it across the finish line!

Mega Tube-Hill

The Mega Tube Hill is made up of 2 straight shots (also used for the Cardboard Sled Race) and a winding course from the top of the WOLBI mountain to the base of Hungary Dorm. The tube and snow will be provided (you just need to provide the energy).

Snow Chute

The Snow Chute is a fast, snow-packed course that runs down the hill next to the Ice Chute. Plastic sleds provide a ride that lasts a few heart-pounding seconds.

Ice Chute

The Word of Life Ranch children's camp waterslide is transformed by icing it down, clearing a path on the frozen lake, and sending campers flying down on the same type of plastic sleds used on the Human Bob Sled course. It is a straight shot onto the ice.

Snowboard Course

Some of the more creative, snowboard loving students build a short snowboard course with jumps, bumps and moguls. It is a short course but will allow your students (or you) to show off their skill. Please bring your own snowboard equipment.

Carpet-Ball

Carpet-ball is simply a dumbed down version of pool, but it has quickly become a favorite activity for students and campers. It is on a 16' long wooden trough with a goal at either end. One player stands at one end, while the other stands on the opposite end. The purpose is to take turns rolling the "cue" ball down to the opposing end, trying to be the first player to knock the other player's pool balls in to the goal.

Rumble Ball

Rumble Ball is an insane combination of Rugby, Soccer and Volleyball. We run pick up games during all of the open activity times.

Indoor Activities

Tired of the cold? There are numerous activities provided in the Field House for campers and leaders. The activities include: Foosball, Air Hockey, X-Box Games, Ping Pong, and various table games. Table and X-Box games can be checked out from our Command Center.

Indoor Climbing Wall

Self-explanatory, perhaps, but we take a slightly different approach. Instead of climbing up, you climb across. Located in the Field House.

Human Sling Shot

Imagine propelling one of your Youth Group Leaders from your church across an icy track to see if you can get the furthest distance. It's kind of like launching a water balloon, only it's a person sliding at insane speeds.

SPORTS RULES

~Churches are permitted to field 2 teams per competition~

HOCKEY RULES

The rules for the Word of Life Hockey Snow Camp Tournament shall be the same as those enforced at all normal regulation international hockey games, with the following exceptions:

1. Game length will be determined at the beginning of the tournament, based upon the number of teams entered in the tournament. A "running clock" will be established.
2. The number of players allowed on the ice at one time is five, including a goalie.
3. There will be a referee on the ice at all times. All decisions made by the head referee are final.
4. There will be no icing calls made at any time.
5. Penalties will be given, resulting in the puck being given to the opposing team.

BASKETBALL RULES

1. The games will be played with a running clock (clock doesn't stop). The length of the game will depend on the number of teams entering the tournament. The length of games will be announced at the beginning of the tournament.
2. When fouled on a shot, the team fouled will receive ONE POINT and the BALL. When fouled on a shot that is made, the team will receive 3 POINTS and the opposing team will gain possession of the ball.
3. There are no time outs, except in the championship game.
4. A team consists of five players. There can only be a maximum of two non-campers on the floor at one time. Youth leaders (currently serving) and counselors are the only eligible non-campers.
5. The championship game will consist of two running time halves; the length will be determined prior to the start of the game. The clock will stop in the LAST TWO MINUTES of the game on every dead ball. Fouls on shots in the last two minutes of the game will be ruled the same as in the preliminary games. However, two free throws will be awarded for each non-shooting foul during the last two minutes of the game. Teams will be awarded one time out per half. They are not transferable.
6. Substitutes must enter the game on dead balls.
7. No Back Court Violation except during Championship games.
8. Technical fouls will result in two points and the ball and the ejection of the player.
9. Intentional fouls will result in two points and the ball.

CO-ED VOLLEYBALL RULES

1. Rally scoring will be in effect. A point will be awarded after each serve, regardless of which team had possession last. In other words, a team does not have to have possession of the serve to win the point.
2. The length per match depends on the number of teams entering the Tourney. You will be notified at the beginning of the Tourney whether it is timed or a set score.
3. Teams must win by one point. In case of a tie, the next point wins, including the ball in play.
4. Championship games will be played to a set score with no time limit. Rally scoring will be in effect.
5. Six players per team are allowed on the court. There must be at least 2 GIRLS on the court at all times. There can be no more than 2 NON-CAMPERS on the court at all times (Youth leaders or Counselors).

FLAG FOOTBALL RULES

1. Play with 10-15 minutes per half with a running clock. (Time may depend on the number of teams.)
 2. Play will be sideways on the field about 40 yards.
 3. Each team will have four plays to reach midfield to get a first down and then four more plays to score.
 4. Scoring is seven points for each touchdown and there is no extra point or field goal.
 5. Refs will be calling penalties for: 1) tackling (its *flag* football) 2) delay of game (each team will have 25 seconds to have their next play off) 3) pass interference 4) holding 5) false start and off-sides.
 6. Anyone displaying a bad attitude or tackling will first receive a warning. The second time they will be ejected from the game.
 7. After a flag is pulled, it must be held up so that the refs can see it and then handed back to the appropriate player.
 8. There are no fake punts or on-side kicks. On a punt there is NO rush from the defense.
 9. There are NO fumbles, once the ball hits the ground it is dead at that spot and the team with last possession will have the ball at that spot. On kicks, the ball may hit the ground and then be picked up as long as it is not dropped.
 10. Each team gets one time-out each half.
 11. No straight-arm and no flag guarding. First time is a warning; the second time, a penalty.
 12. Each team must have 5 players lined up on the Line of Scrimmage.
 13. A team will consist of 11 players but only 3 NON-CAMPERS are allowed on the field at a time.
 14. Some rules may vary depending on the number of players per team.

CO-ED DODGEBALL RULES

1. A game consists of the best out of three matches. Once you have lost a game you are eliminated.
2. Each team can consist of as many players as you want but there can only be 10 on the Floor per game.
3. Each team must also consist of at least 3 girls and no more than 2 NON-CAMPERS.
4. You get "OUT" when you either get HIT BY A BALL thrown by the opposing team or someone from the opposing team CATCHES YOUR THROW. EXCEPTIONS: You are hit in the head, the ball bounces before hitting you; the ball you throw hits something other than a person before getting caught. If you are holding a ball you can also use it to knock down a ball thrown from the opposing team.
5. Once you are "OUT," the only way to reenter a match is if someone from your team makes the ball in the opposing team's basketball hoop.
6. The match is over when everyone on your team is "OUT", or when the time limit expires.
7. There will be Referees; do not argue with their calls and be honest.
8. A camper or youth leader whose team has been eliminated CANNOT join another team, even if from the same church.

CO-ED IN-DOOR SOCCER RULES

1. 5 on 5 soccer (four players and one goalie).
2. Sidelines and net are out of bounds.
3. Back walls are considered in bounds.
4. Goalie is in designated box and can use hands only in that marked off area.
5. When goalie throws the ball it must hit the ground before midfield.
6. Coin-toss determines kick-off.
7. All out of bound plays result in an indirect kick (kick at spot where the ball went out).
8. There must be two girls on the "field" at all times.
9. Overtime is a shoot-out on the big nets with three shooters. If there is still a tie, there will be a sudden death shoot out.

10. Typical High School rules: no tripping, no handballs, etc.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

1. Each player may play on only one team per sport. If that player loses and is eliminated from the tournament, they cannot join another team in that sport.
2. Counselors may play only with the campers that they are assigned to counsel.
3. Violation of any regulations may result in a team disqualification at the discretion of officials. In other words a team may not benefit (win) as a result of violating regulations.
4. The time or point limit of each game may vary depending on how many teams participate.
